



HEBE HAVEN YACHT CLUB PORT SHELTER REGATTA 2022

(Part of Steering the Course Women's Sailing Festival 2022)

Saturday and Sunday, 8 & 9 October 2022

NOTICE OF RACE

*Hebe Haven Yacht Club (the **Organising Authority**) is pleased to again to present the annual Port Shelter Regatta, a challenging combination of geometric courses and a race around the picturesque islands of eastern Hong Kong over two days. The Club invites all sailors to join the Regatta.*

Limited overnight pontoon spaces are available for visiting boats participating in the regatta.

The notation '[DP]' in a rule in this Notice of Race means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1 RULES

The event will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2021-2024, together with:

- The prescriptions of the Hong Kong Sailing Federation;
- IRC Rules Parts A, B and C apply except that Rule 22.4 only applies to Sportsboat and One-design Classes;
- There will be no limitations on crew number or weight except as required for boats rated as One-design, which shall comply with IRC Rule 22.4.1;
- The HKPN handicap system as administered by the HKSF and the HKPN Committee;
- The Rules of the SMS system for the Sportsboat Class;
- Class Rules, including safety rules, where they apply;
- World Sailing Offshore Special Regulations Appendix B, Special Regulations for inshore racing. Sportsboat and J/80 Classes have dispensation for Clause 3.02 of these Regulations;
- The Hebe Haven Yacht Club Standard Sailing Instructions of June 2021 (HHYC SSI);
- This Notice of Race and the Port Shelter Regatta 2022 Sailing Instructions.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available online on or before 12:00 noon, on Thursday, 29 September 2022.

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 Notices to Competitors, Protest Time Limits, penalty information and other pertinent information will be posted in accordance with HHYC SSI 3.
- 3.2 On the water the Race Officer will monitor and communicate with competitors on Channel 72. In accordance with HHYC SSI 25 all boats are required to carry a VHF radio and keep a listening watch on Channel 72. Channel 77 may be used as a back-up.
- 3.3 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that are not available to all boats.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The Event is open to all boats in the following Classes:
 - IRC Class - monohull boats holding a valid IRC rating;
 - HKPN Class - boats holding a valid HKPN;
 - Sportsboat Class - holding a valid SMS rating; and
 - One-design Classes – Dragon and J/80.
- 4.2 The IRC and HKPN Classes may be sub-divided into divisions based on suitable rating bands. Provisional rating bands are:

IRC	HKPN
Division A: 1.171 and above	Division A: 1219 and below
Division B: 1.055-1.170	Division B: 1220 and above
Division C: 1.054 and below	

- 4.3 Boats may only enter only one class or division for the regatta.
- 4.4 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online entry form at [this link](#) (also accessible by scanning the QR code on the right) by 12:00 noon on Tuesday, 4 October 2022. This will assist the Race Committee in making final decisions on the division splits for IRC and HKPN classes.
- 4.5 Late entries may also be made on the water on the day of racing by hailing the Committee Boat not later than one minute before the first warning signal. Late entrants MUST submit an online entry form at the HHYC race office before 5pm on the day of the race. Late entrants will be charged an additional administration fee of \$200.
- 4.6 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.
- 4.7 For the Sportsboat and J/80 Classes, a minimum of three entries for the Series is required by the deadline stated in Clause 4.4 of this NoR. Should there be less than three entries at the deadline, the Race Committee may incorporate these boats into other classes and the affected Class may be cancelled for the Series. The Sportsboat boats may be incorporated into IRC division according to their RHKYC's ATI Rating. A Notice to Competitors will be issued to effect any change in this respect, no later than three hours before the first warning signal on the first race day.



5 FEES

5.1 The race fees for the Regatta are shown as below:

5.2 The entry fees are non-refundable. Entry fees will not be refunded or adjusted in the event of a race or races being abandoned or cancelled.

9 SCHEDULE

9.1 Races are scheduled as follows:

Sunday 9 October 2022	Races 2 & 3 – Geometric Course(s)	11:55

9.2 Race 3 will be started as soon as possible after all boats in a class or division have finished or are deemed to have retired from the previous race.

9.3 In the event that Race 1 is postponed or abandoned it may be re-run on the Sunday.

9.4 The starting sequence for all classes/divisions will be included in the Sailing Instructions or, if amended subsequently, will be posted on the Official Notice Board at HHYC on or before 12:00 noon on Friday, 7 October 2022.

10 MEASUREMENT

IRC and SMS classes are required to submit a copy of their current rating certificate(s) for the 2022-23 period, to the Sailing Centre at HHYC or by email to racing@hhyc.org.hk, no later than 12:00 noon on Thursday, 6 October 2022.

12 VENUE

All races will start in the general vicinity of Shelter Island (which may extend to the outside of Table Island if wind conditions so demand).

13 COURSES

The courses for all races are provided in the HHYC SSI.

15 SCORING

15.1 There shall be no discards in the Regatta.

15.2 One race is required to be completed to constitute the Regatta.

15.3 RRS rule A5.3 will apply.

22 RISK STATEMENT

- 22.1 RRS 3 states: “The responsibility for a boat’s decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone”. By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes. All those taking any part in the event do so at their own risk.
- 22.2 The Organising Authority and its associates and appointees accept no responsibility or liability for any inconvenience, loss, damage or injury howsoever caused.
- 22.3 All boats must comply with the HHYC Policy on Personal Flotation Devices.

23 INSURANCE

All boats shall be insured with at least the minimum cover of valid third-party liability insurance required under HKSAR legislation.

24 PRIZES

- 24.1 Subject to prevailing HKSAR Government restrictions, it is intended that there will be Prizes for individual races and overall prizes for the Port Shelter Regatta will be awarded after racing on Sunday, 9 October 2022.
- 24.2 As part of Steering the Course Women’s Sailing Festival 2022, a special award will be presented to the ladies helm winner of this regatta. Only boats helmed by a female competing in the J/80 or HKPN divisions are eligible to compete for this award. The winner will be declared based on the results of the two geometric races held on 9 October 2022. In order to be eligible for this award, boats must notify the OA of their intent when entering the regatta.
- 24.3 All trophies presented must be returned to the Sailing Centre or to a member of the Race Committee immediately for engraving. Trophies will remain at the Club for display. Boats not complying with this requirement will be subject to a \$2,000 replacement fee and may be refused entry to future events.

- A **Limited overnight pontoon spaces** will be reserved for visiting boats participating in the Regatta to raft up. Reservation will be according to their completion of the online entry, on a first-come, first served basis. Interested skippers should email to racing@hhyc.org.hk within 24 hours after completing their entry.
- B Visiting members of ABC and RHKYC may sign chits on race days to be charged to their home club accounts. Visitors should advise staff of their membership details before placing orders. Our staff may request to see the membership card of any visitor prior to accepting an order. We accept payment by Octopus from competitors not members of Hebe Haven Yacht Club.
